WHO WE ARE AND WHAT WE DO

Our mission is to transform the lives of youth at risk of homelessness by providing them with the opportunity to rebuild their lives and unlock their full potential. These young individuals are in a pivotal stage of transitioning into adulthood, and often due to challenging circumstances, they have not yet acquired the essential health, personal, social, and life skills necessary for independent living.

To achieve this mission, we offer a comprehensive array of programs and services aimed at empowering youth to successfully rebuild their lives and make the challenging transition into independent living and adulthood. Our support programs are multifaceted, addressing acute instances of homelessness, facilitating the acquisition of crucial life skills, fostering positive relationships with peers and adults, reengaging with educational opportunities, progressing towards higher learning, and gaining and maintaining employment.

Our approach begins with the identification of youth who are at risk of homelessness. In taking this vital first step, we closely examine the factors that have pushed these youth from stability to instability, leading them to be at risk. These situations encompass a wide spectrum, ranging from issues such as drug and alcohol addiction to various forms of mental illness and intellectual inability.

Above all, the safety and well-being of these youth remain our paramount concern, driving our commitment to creating a brighter future for each of them.





"Transitional housing refers to a supportive – yet temporary – type of accommodation that is meant to bridge the gap from homelessness to permanent housing by offering structure, supervision, support (for addictions and mental health, for instance), life skills, and in some cases, education and training".

"Transitional housing is conceptualized as an intermediate step between emergency crisis shelter and permanent housing. It is more long-term, service-intensive and private than emergency shelters, yet remains time-limited to stays of three months to three years. It is meant to provide a safe, supportive environment where residents can overcome trauma, begin to address the issues that led to homelessness or kept them homeless, and begin to rebuild their support network". Home Horizon's Transitional Housing and Outreach Services strives to meet the standards set out in the definition, set out by the Homeless Hub. Under the direction of Executive Director, Steven Pelletier, the staff at both the Barbara Weider House and Outreach Services have developed and deliver programming to youth to support them in their journey to prepare for permanent housing.

Youth are given the opportunity to access mental health and addiction counselling through funds provided through Bell Let's Talk, the Collingwood General and Marine Hospital Grant, as well as private donations. Programming has been developed to nurture the needs of the youth – mind, body and soul, to ensure they are well prepared for success when they are ready to move on to permanent housing.

Home Horizon has had many successes this year. Some of our residents have gone on to post-secondary education after earning their high school diplomas while residing at Barbara Weider House. Several others have transitioned to permanent housing because they were able to secure employment with the support of Home Horizon staff.

Those youth who are homeless in the community are being supported through our Youth Outreach Services. Through partnerships with organizations in our community, many are connected to other resources to help support them while they wait for transitional housing placement.

The Board of Directors wishes to acknowledge the hard work and dedication of the staff. The Board works very hard to ensure that programming and operational funds are available so we can continue to offer the much-needed services both through the Barbara Weider House and the Youth Outreach program. Our generous community continues to financially support Home Horizon which allows operations to continue, and in fact expand on the programming that benefits the youth. Home Horizon is part of the new Coordinated Access system that is being introduced throughout Simcoe County. As this system roles out, our youth will benefit from the increased partnerships that are being fostered through Coordinated Access.

This year the Board of Directors has introduced education to all staff and Board members in Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion so that youth know that Home Horizon is a safe space for them.

I will conclude by thanking Home Horizon Board and staff for their dedication to the meaningful support offered to the most vulnerable youth within our community. We would like to give a big thank you to the community for their ongoing support to Home Horizon. Without your overwhelming generosity, Home Horizon could not provide the essential support needed for the vulnerable youth in the community.



FUNDRAISING REPORT



Thanks to the incredible generosity of our donors, sponsors and event participants we had another successful fundraising year. Donors contributed 78% of total revenues which enabled us to deliver life-changing programs and services to youth experiencing homelessness in our community. With the expansion of the house in 2022 from 6 to 10 beds, and the expansion of the programming we offer to both youth living at the Barbara Weider House and the youth we assist through our Outreach Program, our expenses have increased year over year. Despite the increase in expenses, we ended our fiscal year in a strong financial position with a surplus. As noted in our financial statements, surplus funds are allocated to reserves that are available for emergencies, program enhancements, building our capital fund and funding our strategic initiatives. These reserves are critical for the long term sustainability of our operations and our ability to expand our services and the number of youth we serve.



We would like to take this opportunity to sincerely thank all our donors, sponsors and event participants. Youth facing homelessness in South Georgian Bay need our services and supports more than ever, particularly with the sky-rocketing cost of living and lack of affordable housing. Thanks to your generosity we were able to expand our programming this past year and increase the number of youth we served. We can't thank you enough and hope that you will continue to support Home Horizon and the Barbara Weider House.



Signature Events and Community Support

Home Horizon depends on three major signature events every year which generate approximately 30% of our total revenues. Barbara Weider House - Youth Transitional Housing Program

The Barbara Weider House is a ten-bedroom facility that provides a secure and stable transitional housing option for youth a risk of homelessness in South Georgian Bay. We have created an environment where our residents receive dedicated support from our staff teams, enabling them to find the necessary space to cope, adapt, and heal. Our primary focus is to maintain a positive forward trajectory by assisting them in identifying and working towards their goals.

At the BWH, we have integrated our Youth Thrive program, allowing us to customize our services to meet the evolving needs of our residents. We offer round-the-clock supervision and have a team of skilled and dedicated staff who guide them through both highs and lows, help them acquire essential life skills, foster positive relationships with peers and adults, support their reengagement with school and family and provide a wide range of enriching experiences.

Youth Outreach Services

Since 2020, our Youth Outreach Program has played a vital role within Home Horizon's offerings. During the pandemic, we witnessed a surge in demand for our services, prompting us to extend our support to homeless youth beyond the Barbara Weider House. This program is designed to aid youth in their current living situations, focusing on supplying essential items like meals, hygiene products, tents, blankets, gift cards and clothing. Furthermore, we facilitate access to community resources, facilitate health support, and offer a wide range of additional assistance to homeless youth within our communities.

Youth Thrive

At Home Horizon, we strive to offer more than just transitional housing. Our goal is to equip youth with essential life skills for independent living through a comprehensive program. Youth Thrive provides integrated support in various areas, including mental health counselling, education, employment, physical well-being, life skills development, and socialization. This program empowers youth in their personal growth journey, fostering a balanced and thriving lifestyle. We adhere to the principle of "nothing for us, without us," valuing the expertise of youth in their own lives. Their voices, opinions, and choices actively guide decision-making and program planning, ensuring its relevance and alignment with the unique needs and aspirations of the youth we serve.

Homelessness Diversion

Our approach to tackling youth homelessness emphasizes early intervention. We assist youth by examining the factors that transitioned them from stability to instability and put them at risk. Our strategy involves employing a range of support services to proactively address the risk of homelessness at its earliest stages.

Program Interaction

Home Horizon's programs are intentionally interconnected, forming a cyclical structure where each program complements the others. Often, our initial client interactions occur during outreach activities, allowing us to identify residents who would benefit from the Barbara Weider House program. During their stay at Barbara Weider House, youth set goals and engage in a spectrum of services and experiences coordinated through Youth Thrive Programming. As they prepare to transition to independent living, our cycle concludes with our outreach program, enabling us to monitor their progress, offer support as necessary, and ensure their ongoing wellbeing.
